On Thursday, February 11<sup>th</sup>, the Church celebrates the feast of ***Our Lady of Lourdes***. In 1858, in the grotto of Massabielle, near Lourdes in southern France, Our Lady appeared 18 times to Bernadette Soubirous, a young peasant girl. She revealed herself as the Immaculate Conception, asked that a chapel be built on the site of the vision, and told the girl to drink from a fountain in the grotto. No fountain was to be seen, but when Bernadette dug at a spot designated by the apparition, a spring began to flow. The water from this still flowing spring has shown remarkable healing power, though it contains

no curative property that science can identify. Lourdes has become the most famous modern shrine of Our Lady
