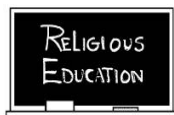

**CHRISTIAN UNITY:** The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is a week for all Christians to pray together for unity, following the example of Episcopal priest Paul Wattson, who sought to have the Anglican and Roman Catholic churches united. The first observance occurred in 1908 as Church Unity Week and began on the Feast of the Chair of Peter, and ended on the Feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul. Each year the theme and texts for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity are initially prepared by an international group whose members are appointed by the Faith and Order Commission of the World Council of Churches and the Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity. The Second Vatican Council's Decree on Ecumenism, promulgated in 1964, called prayer the soul of the ecumenical movement. Churches throughout the world are encouraged to pray for and with each other, focusing on our common faith in Christ.
